Divine d'Or



New Zealand breeder/trainer Erana Shattock's dream of breeding a dilute colored Thoroughbred from the Tapit sireline came true on May 2nd when her Palomino Thoroughbred mare Amber Empress delivered a golden filly by Divining Rod at Country Life Farm. The beautiful filly has already been named Divine d'Or.

A breeder of colored sporthorses in her country, Erana also trains
Thoroughbreds to race there. She wanted to improve her Thoroughbred
bloodlines and favored the Tapit line. Frosted was the only Tapit standing in NZ
or AUS, but he was out of the running because his grey color would dominate
the dilute palomino gene of the mare.

Erana looked to the U.S. for bay sons of Tapit that could run and found Divining Rod, arguably one of his best-bred sons who was also quite accomplished on the racetrack. Divining Rod won over \$882,000 in 17 starts, with 5 wins including the G3 Coolmore Lexington Stakes. He was a nose from winning the G1 Cigar Mile and placed in six other graded stakes, including running 3rd in the G1 Preakness. His dam Precious Kitten was a multiple G1-winner and half-sister to leading sire Kitten's Joy, so the pedigree was just what Erana wanted.

While Amber Empress never raced, her dam Lady Livingston (by El Prado) won a Maiden Special at Calder and is a full sister to multiple stakes winner Mr. Livingston, who won or placed in 14 stakes races, including a win in the G3 Palm Beach Stakes. Lady Livingston herself has produced 4 winners from 4 starters and two of her other daughters have now produced blacktype.

Erana hopes to be the first breeder of a dilute colored Thoroughbred stakes winner with this fine filly by Divining Rod. We'll be following Divine d'Or in the coming years - she won't be hard to miss!

When Country Life's broodmare manager Cheyenne Piccolo was young she rode Western. After getting back into riding several years ago she bought a horse last year that was marketed as a Quarter Horse-cross mare. Days after getting her home, Cheyenne discovered that she had a lip tattoo. Turns out Gypsy was a Thoroughbred and her registered name was Pretty Accolade (by Proud Accolade). Gypsy didn't win a race at the track (her best finish was a 3rd at Parx in 10 starts, albeit with Jose Ortiz aboard), but she has proven her worth as a pleasure horse, and in Western tack.

Cheyenne has started showing again this year in Western Ranch Riding classes and Gypsy has handled everything like a pro. She even goes bridleless for Cheyenne at home, cantering around the ring in just a neck strap. Just another way these Thoroughbreds display their willing attitude and athleticism when their racing careers are done.

Speaking of other things Thoroughbreds can do, how about steeplechase and hurdles? Springtime is the season for jump races, and some not-yet-retired racehorses were showcasing their talents over fences at the Potomac Hunt Races on Sunday, May 21st. There were two CLF-sired Maryland-breds running in a Maiden Hurdle race going 2 miles and they finished 1-2.

Icandothat, a Divining Rod gelding bred and raised by Vivian Rall about 15 minutes from Country Life, won the race with Love Saga, a Mosler filly bred by Country Life & Sagamoon partners, finishing a close 2nd. He may not be finished flat racing either, as he was entered in a turf race at Delaware Park recently.
